(Yam, Bahadur, 2022) Multicultural education emerged as a response to social injustice, aiming to educate service professionals in multicultural competencies to handle diverse students with inclusive teaching strategies. ## 2. Development History

The concept of multicultural education developed in response to social, political, and demographic changes affecting society. The civil rights movement and the elimination of racial segregation in schools were the initial impetus for the development of multicultural education. Over the past few decades, multicultural education has become a major focus in education policy in many countries around the world in an effort to create inclusive and equitable learning environments for all students.

## **B. Cultural Diversity**

### **1. Understanding and Dimensions of Cultural Diversity**

(Mohammad, Hashim, 2022) It develops over time through interactions with nature and social norms, enriched by diverse social and religious backgrounds. (Vincenzo, 2016)

### **2. The Importance of Recognition and Respect for Diversity**

Recognition of cultural diversity values the uniqueness of each individual and group, while respect for cultural diversity creates an environment that values different perspectives and experiences.
